The dinette area doubles as a comfortable place to dine or relax, and can also convert into a sleeping area if needed. The galley is compact yet practical, offering a fridge, cooker, sink, and generous storage – ideal for preparing meals during weekend adventures or longer stays aboard.

The forward cabin serves as the boat's main sleeping quarters, with room to comfortably accommodate up to four people.
